Capital Project Update

The Capital Project Committee has been working collaboratively with our architects at CSArch and School House Construction to review the updated estimates for the capital project. The team expects to go out to bid in the next couple of weeks and begin work in the early spring. Given an uptick in costs for materials, the project scope has changed slightly and will include the following:

- 1.) Fuel Oil Tank Replacement
- 2.) Concrete equipment pad underneath the existing well tanks to raise the tanks off of the floor.
- 3.) Hardware upgrades and door replacements, as required to meet code at all stairwells and increase security.
- 4.) Hardware upgrades, security film and door replacements at all exterior doors identified by the district.
- 5.) Replacement of the Library and Band room doors for increased security.
- 6.) Installation of cross corridor security door near the Main Office, Gymnasium Lobby and relocation of the Kindergarten Classroom door for security purposes.
- 7.) Replacement of the roof drains over the Main Office area.
- 8.) Installation of scupper boxes and downspouts at the South elevation to capture roof drainage and direct it to grade.
- 9.) Replacement and expansion of the parking lot, improving drainage away from the building and replacement of the retaining walls.



Area Superintendents Meet with the Commissioner of Education

On October 14th, I had the pleasure of joining a group of area Superintendents to meet with Dr. Betty Rosa, Commissioner of Education, Beverly Ouderkirk, New York State Regent, Dr. James Baldwin, Sr. Deputy Commissioner for Education, Emily DeSantis, Assistant Commissioner for Public Affairs and Mr. David Frank, Chief of Staff P20. The meeting took place at Queensbury Union Free School District with the purpose of engaging in numerous roundtable discussions centered around policies, trends and issues that schools are experiencing in the North Country. Roundtable topics included concerns with teacher shortages and current applicant pool sizes in addition to teacher certification. We also shared with the Commissioner how school districts are using federal monies and the current status of students who have returned to school from remote or hybrid learning experiences last year. The Commissioner and her team were eager to hear from area Superintendents about how we have been managing COVID and learn more about mental health services and supports that have been made available to students in the region.

The meeting provided an opportunity for Superintendents in the Warren, Saratoga, Washington, Hamilton and Essex counties to advocate on a number of issues and truly provide the Commissioner and her team with first hand experience with how upstate schools are navigating a number of issues. It is our hope that continued conversations and follow up can take place going forward.

i-Ready Diagnostic & Instruction

Have you ever grabbed a flathead screwdriver only to find out the job you needed to do required a phillips head? Using the right tool to complete a job is really important. It allows you to do it in less time and it ensures that it gets done completely and correctly.

Here at Newcomb we just completed administering the first of three i-Ready diagnostics (Fall, Winter, Spring) to our students in grades k-12. i-Ready is a powerful tool we are using for the first time to not only help us understand your child's individual learning needs, but it also has the ability to provide specific skill instruction. It is important that we get accurate results so we can tailor learning to your child's strengths and areas of growth. Think of Cinderella and her glass slipper, which fits her perfectly. Accurate scores will help us meet your child where they are, fill in any learning gaps, and challenge them at just the right level - a perfect fit! If students did not try their best, went too fast or did not take their time to carefully answer the question, we may end up asking them to do work that they already know how to do, causing them to be bored and frustrated. The opposite is also true, where if they get too much help, or use resources to look up answers, it could lead us to give work that is too difficult and frustrating.

i-Ready is a little like choosing your own adventure program. Each student had different questions – no two assessments were alike. Some questions were too easy; some too hard and your child did not know the answer. This was expected and OK! Part of the adventure of this assessment is to locate where the learning "sweet spot" is for your child in math and reading. The Diagnostic & Instruction assesses and teaches the following skill areas:

Reading

- Math
- Phonological Awareness

- Phonics
- High-Frequency Words
- Vocabulary
- Comprehension

- Number and Operations
- Algebra and Algebraic Thinking
- Measurement and Data
- Geometry

FROM THE GUIDANCE OFFICE

SENIORS:

- All seniors going off to college will need to fill out the <u>FAFSA</u>. You can apply on-line, which saves a lot of time. Before you can do that <u>you and a parent</u> need to register for a FSA ID. To get your FSA ID you can go to <u>www.fsaid.ed.gov</u>. If your parents or siblings have a PIN, they can "link" their PIN number to their FSA ID. This will aid in transferring your information from PIN to your FSA ID. When you receive your FSA ID number go to <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u> to apply for Financial Aid. Financial Aid forms can be filled out beginning in October this year, using last year's tax returns. You should do this right away. Doing them on-line is much faster and easier.
- Check your application deadlines! Applications should be out <u>by</u> December 1st. (Check your college deadline dates) If you want your transcripts to go out before Thanksgiving, you need to let me know which colleges to send them to by November 12, 2021.
- Please check your application before you send it out. Check spellings, print neatly, and check your grammar!!
- Ask at least 2 teachers to write you a letter of recommendation to keep in my office so that I can send them out with your applications.
- *VISIT* the colleges you plan to apply to! You are going to want to be at a place that you like. You won't know that unless you take a tour. This year you may have to take your tour virtually, but it is still important to see the campus you plan to live.
- I need your updated Transcripts or Resumes so that I can send the college's accurate information. Please list all activities you have done grades 9-12, so that I don't forget anything. Please include any Volunteer Work you have done. Remember, volunteering means you are not receiving money for the work you are doing. Example: Class fundraising is not Volunteer work. You are receiving money for a senior trip for all class fundraising activities.


Reminder to parents of 3rd through 8th grade students

Grades 4 & 8 Science Written Test: Monday, June 6, 2022



From the Health Office



Dear Newcomb Central School Families,

As we approach the holiday season (and cold and flu season!), I would like to remind you that COVID-19 screening testing is offered to unvaccinated students at Newcomb Central School.

In collaboration with Essex County Health Department, we are able to offer pooled screening testing using Clarifi. The Clarifi COVID-19 test is the most sensitive saliva test available at this time. Over 2 million of these tests have been used in colleges and K-12 schools in New York State. The test is a very simple and painless **saliva swab** that the student can easily self-administer. It takes approximately one minute for our students to receive the test during the school day. Results from Clarifi testing return in 24-48 hours from being sent out.

Testing is offered weekly, although participation weekly is not required.

To participate in the testing program, you must complete the following steps:

- 1. Register a new account at: <u>app.Clarifi-COVID-19.com</u>. A User Guide is available on this site.
- 2. Create a profile for each minor student in your care. (Note: You can register multiple student profiles under each account).
- 3. Do not attempt to *Register a COVID-19 Test*. This step will be done by the testing team on the day of your student's test.

We are also able to conduct diagnostic testing of ill students using Clarifi. This is offered to both unvaccinated and unvaccinated students. If you would like your student to be able to have a diagnostic test conducted at school, please sign your student up using the link above, and then let me know if you are signing your student up for screening testing or diagnostic testing.


