Growing the Future of the Elementary School Initiative:



In alignment with the Grow the Future of the Elementary School initiative, inter-school collaborations have begun for the 2022-2023 school year. This September, NCS welcomed students from Minerva Central School District to join us for an afternoon production of The Three Bears Children's Opera, performed by the Seagle Festival Opera. Students in grades pre-kindergarten through sixth grade enjoyed the experience and had a chance to meet and socialize with peers from a neighboring school.



Students and teachers were excited to welcome new friends into our learning community and we are looking forward to more inter-school collaborations throughout this year!





Internal-School Collaborations with students in grades pre-kindergarten through second grade have also commenced. Pictured above, students learn songs in Spanish with Senora Britt. This cross-grade level experience allows students and teachers to collaborate with one another to design interactive and cross curricular learning experiences. Peer modeling and mentoring enable students to learn from each other from an academic and social perspective. We are eager to welcome students from Minerva in the coming weeks to join us remotely during these Spanish lessons!

Experiential learning experiences are also in process for students in grades pre-kindergarten through second grade. Students in Mr. Gazaille's Materials Processing class is in the process of whittling saplings for sign posts. The sign posts will be used to design an outdoor ABC Trail which will enable the younger students to incorporate movement while learning their letters and sounds in their natural Adirondack environment.

Full STEAM Ahead at NCS:





STEAM is off to a great start this year with all students in grades pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade participating in a STEAM experience on Fridays. This past week, students engaged in problem solving activities with peers as they learned to work in partner groups to overcome unforeseen challenges. Social-emotional learning was also infused into this lesson which targeted self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making. Cross grade level experiences enhanced both communication skills and modeling and allowed all students opportunities to learn from different peer groups.

Newcomb Through the Decades Open House:

It feels like an eternity since the school community has come together to welcome the start of the school year with an open house. Post-COVID, the district will be hosting a Newcomb Through the Decades Open House on Thursday, October 27th from 5:00 pm - 7:30 pm. Why is Your Child's Growth Mindset Important?

Throughout this school year, I will be taking opportunities to help our NCS students and staff learn about their brains and brain malleability. Students will begin to see how it is possible to strengthen their brains and become smarter. They will learn to embrace challenges and mistakes and to praise the process, effort, and perseverance rather than specific abilities or talents. In doing this, teachers will be able to support the development of a growth mindset.

When our students understand how their brains can grow, they are more willing to try new experiences. Any time students experience something unique or ask questions about topics they might not already know about, they are physically growing their brains. This means they are building their intelligence and establishing a growth mindset. Research has shown that when students are taught about brain plasticity and that intelligence is something they can grow, their overall academic performance improves.

It is easy to determine which students in our school already demonstrate a growth mindset. He/She;

- Asks questions when they don't know about a topic
- Eagerly dive into challenging projects
- Persevere when they come across a roadblock
- Put in effort or try things multiple times
- Listen to feedback and apply it
- Get inspired by the achievements of others

FROM THE GUIDANCE OFFICE

All students 8-12: Now is the time to begin thinking about your future career plans. SUNY Adirondack will be hosting an evening College Fair on Thursday, October 6th from 6-8pm in their gymnasium. It is a great opportunity for you to meet with College Representatives and ask questions about what their college offers students.

SENIORS:

All seniors going off to college will need to fill out the <u>FAFSA</u> beginning in OCTOBER. You can apply on-line, which saves a lot of time. Before you can do that <u>you and a parent</u> need to register for a **FSA ID**. To get your **FSA ID** you can go to <u>www.fsaid.ed.gov</u> If your parents or siblings have a PIN, they can "link" their PIN number to their FSA ID. This will aid in transferring your information from PIN to your FSA ID. When you receive your FSA ID number go to <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u> to apply for Financial Aid. Financial Aid forms can be filled out beginning in October this year, using last year's tax returns. You should do this right away. Doing them on-line is much faster and easier.

Check your application deadlines! Applications should be out by December 1st. (Check your college deadline dates) If you want your transcripts to go out before Thanksgiving, you need to let me know which colleges to send them to by **November 10, 2022.**

Please check your application before you send it out. Check spellings, print neatly, and check your grammar!

Ask at least 2 teachers to write you a letter of recommendation to keep in my office so that I can send them out with your applications.

VISIT the colleges you plan to apply to! You are going to want to be at a place that you like. You won't know that unless you take a tour. This year you may have to take your tour virtually, but it is still important to see the campus you plan to live in.

I need your updated Transcripts or Resumes so that I can send the college's accurate information. Please list all activities you have done grades 9-12, so that I don't forget anything. Please include any Volunteer Work you have done. Remember, volunteering means you are not receiving money for the work you are doing. Example: Class fundraising is not Volunteer work. You are receiving money for a senior trip for all class fundraising activities.

PSAT: Wednesday, October 12, 2022 @ 8 a.m.

Juniors (No international students) will have the opportunity to take the PSAT at no cost to you. The purpose of taking this exam is to give you an idea what the SAT exams are like. This is a learning tool to help you prepare for the May/June SAT. Depending on how well you do, you <u>MAY</u> qualify for a merit scholarship.

DATES FOR SOPHOMORES TO REMEMBER

We will be offering the ASVAB to all sophomores (No International Students) on Tuesday, October 18th at 8 am. This is a two part exam. The first part is an actual exam, the second part is when you look at different careers based on your scores, likes and dislikes. The ASVAB is given by the Military, however, we do not release your scores to the military unless you choose to have them sent to them. Part 2, the career exploration date has not been determined yet.

New York State testing will be in April through June. Please make sure your children get plenty of rest before their exams. Also, if you can help it, **please make sure your child does not miss school on the day of an exam.** These exams will be very difficult to make up. Please review the schedule below. From the Health Office

HAPPY HALLOWEEN

Dear Parents/Guardians,

With Halloween quickly approaching we would like to remind everyone that candies that contain nuts/nut products or that are processed in a facility with nuts are not allowed in school. We are committed to providing a safe and welcoming environment for all of the children in our school.

The following remains in effect:

- All students will NOT be allowed to eat peanuts/nuts (or items containing them) in any school environment or vehicle.
- Homemade baked goods/foods will NOT be allowed in school.
- Please read the food labels on packaged items your own child may bring to school to ensure no peanuts, tree nuts, peanut butter or peanut oil is among the ingredients.
- While reading food labels, please be mindful of any statements that indicate that the food item was produced or processed in a building/on equipment where peanuts or tree nuts are also produced/processed, or statements such as "item may contain trace nuts." Labels stating this will NOT be allowed in school.
- If the package does not clearly state "packaged in a facility WITHOUT nuts" the ingredients must be labeled and read to guarantee no nuts/nut products are contained.

Please be mindful of what you are sending to school with your child. Avoidance of nuts can save a life.
