NCS to Merge STEAM with Library Media Skills



According to The Journal of the American Association of School Librarians, "School library programs are in a unique position to play a key role in STEAM education and to serve as powerful hybrid spaces for STEAM learning. The many hats that school librarians currently wear in schools, from information specialist to instructional partner and technology integrator/coach, position media specialists as natural allies and supporters of STEAM education." Beginning this January, NCS will move toward an integrated model for our STEAM and Library Media Skills. Mrs. Meaghan Whitten, our STEAM Provider will be joining our team on a full-time basis as a certified teacher on special assignment covering the library and also continuing to provide STEAM services. Meaghan plans to return to school to secure her supplemental certification in the area of Library Media Skills.

Shared Decision Making Committee Community Connections

4th Graders will NOT have a NYS Science Test this Spring

June 2023 No Grade 4 science test; these students will take new science test in grade 5 in 2024 Last administration of Grade 8 science test aligned to the 1996 Standards

There will NOT be a 4th grade NYS science assessment this school year. June 2023 will also be the last year for the 8th grade NYS Science Assessment aligned to the 1996 standards. Beginning in the Spring of 2024, New York State will be unveiling new science tests in both Grades 5 and 8 to align with the Next Generation Standards. In order to prepare for these tests with authentic, hands-on laboratory experiences, students will participate in a series of required activities called *Investigations.* The Investigations are designed to be embedded into instruction and can be offered any time during the school year.

Students <u>must</u> successfully complete the required *Investigations* before the administration of the Elementary - or Intermediate-level science tests. At least 15% of the questions on the written test will measure content related to the performance expectations measured by the *Investigations*. Other questions will assess concepts related to the activities undertaken by students in the *Investigations*.

The four required Investigations for Elementary-level Science and the primary performance expectations measured by each are:

- Structure and Properties of Matter: What's in the Bag?
- Weather and Climate: Cloud in a Bottle
- Energy: Light It Up
- Life Cycles and Traits: Circle of Life

The four required Investigations for Intermediate-level Science and the primary performance expectations measured by each are:

- Structures and Properties of Matter: All Mixed Up
- Energy: Cool It!
- Weather and Climate: Air Mass Matters
- Structure Function and Information Processing: It's Alive?

Seniors:

1. All seniors going off to college will need to fill out the <u>FAFSA</u> (<u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>) which began in October this year. You can apply on-line, which saves a lot of time. Before you can do that <u>you</u> <u>and a parent</u> need to register for a FSA ID. To get your FSA ID you can go to fsaid.ed.gov.

2. Make sure you have a copy of everything for your own records, <u>BEFORE</u> you mail it out. Be sure to check <u>your college</u> deadlines for financial aid forms!! YOU NEED TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID EVERY YEAR!!!!

3. If you have not done so already, you need to get your college applications ready to send out. The sooner the better!!

4. Parents of seniors: Please keep an eye out in the mail for scholarship opportunities. I usually send them out in the winter/spring. I send all scholarship opportunities home to each senior's family. You will need to read the qualifications to see if your child/family qualifies for the scholarships, before your child applies.

SELECTIVE SERVICE/ DRAFT REGISTRATION

All male citizens of the United States are required to register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. Registration forms are available at the post office or at www.sss.gov. Federal financial aid programs for college will be withheld from students who fail to comply.

PLEASE BE MINDFUL WHEN SENDING FOOD TO SCHOOL WITH YOUR STUDENT


The following NCS policies are in effect:

- All students will NOT be allowed to eat peanuts/nuts (or items containing them) in any school environment or vehicle.
- Homemade baked goods/foods will NOT be allowed in school.
- Please read the food labels on packaged items your own child may bring to school to ensure no peanuts, tree nuts, peanut butter or peanut oil is among the ingredients.
- While reading food labels, please be mindful of any statements that indicate that the food item was produced or processed in a building/on equipment where peanuts or tree nuts are also produced/processed, or statements such as "item may contain trace nuts." Labels stating this will NOT be allowed in school.
- If the package does not clearly state "packaged in a facility WITHOUT nuts" the ingredients must be labeled and read to guarantee no nuts/nut products are contained.

While many allergic reactions can be mild, most children with peanut and other nut allergies experience serious symptoms after eating, touching or smelling peanuts or any nut products (especially peanut butter). Please take time to read the labels on any food that you purchase for your child to bring to school.
